Lent (Latin: Quadragesima, 'Fortieth') is a solemn religious observance in the Christian liturgical calendar that begins on Ash Wednesday and ends approximately six weeks later, before Easter Sunday. The purpose of Lent is the preparation of the believer for Easter through prayer, doing penance, mortifying the flesh, repentance of sins, almsgiving, and self -denial. This event is observed in the Anglican, Eastern dox, Lutheran, Methodist, Moravian, Presbyterian, Oriental Orthodox, Reformed, and Roman Catholic Churches. Some Anabaptist and evangelical churches also observe the Lenten season.

The last week of Lent is <u>Holy Week</u>, starting with <u>Palm Sunday</u>. Following the New Testament story, Jesus' <u>crucifixion</u> is commemorated on <u>Good Friday</u>, and at the beginning of the next week the joyful celebration of <u>Easter Sunday</u> recalls the <u>Resurrection of Jesus Christ</u>.

In Lent, many Christians commit to <u>fasting</u>, as well as giving up certain <u>luxuries</u> in order to replicate the account of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ's journey <u>into the desert</u> for 40 days; this is known as one's <u>Lenten sacrifice</u>. Many Christians also add a Lenten spiritual discipline, such as reading a <u>daily devotional</u> or praying through a <u>Lenten calendar</u>, to draw themselves near to God. The <u>Stations of the Cross</u>, a devotional commemoration of <u>Christ's carrying the Cross</u> and of <u>his execution</u>, are often observed. Many <u>Roman Catholic</u> and some <u>Protestant</u> churches remove flowers from their altars, while <u>crucifixes</u>, religious statues, and other elaborate religious symbols are often veiled in violet fabrics in solemn observance of the event. Throughout <u>Christendom</u>, some adherents mark the season with the traditional abstention from the consumption of meat, most notably among Lutherans, Roman Catholics and Anglicans.

Lent is traditionally described as lasting for 40 days, in commemoration of the <u>40 days Jesus spent fasting in the desert</u>, according to the Gospels of <u>Matthew</u>, <u>Mark</u> and <u>Luke</u>, before beginning his <u>public ministry</u>, during which he endured temptation by <u>Satan</u>. Depending on the Christian denomination and local custom, Lent ends either on the evening of Maundy Thursday, or at sundown on Holy Saturday, when the Easter Vigil is celebrated. Regardless, Lenten practices are properly maintained until the evening of Holy Saturday.

The Trustee for 3 years moves to 2 years and the. Trustee for 2 years moves to 1 year. A Trustee for 3 years must be elected

It might advisable to mention at this time that the constitution clearly point out that if an *EXECUTIVE* member who missed *3 consecutive meetings* without a valid reason is no longer considered to hold that office and could be replaced

A copy of nominations from the April meeting and a list of present members in our Council will be available soon.

It is important that all nominations must be confirmed at the May meeting. In other words members must be at the meeting to answer to the nomination or submit a letter or email to me of their intentions. The success of our Council in the coming year will greatly depend on the outcome of this exercise.

REFLECTION

We are well into Lent and we should feel that we are in the **groove** as they say, *in our prayer life, fasting and penance*. Is this not, rather, the fast that I choose: releasing those bound unjustly, untying the thongs of the yoke; *Setting free the oppressed, breaking off every yoke?* Is it not sharing our bread with the hungry, bringing the afflicted and the homeless into your house; Clothing the naked when you see them, and not turning your back on your own flesh (Isaiah 58: 6-7)

This retreat is sponsored by our CWL and they are providing some snacks and drinks. Just down the road Fr Nick is holding a parish Lenten Mission, starting March 22nd to March 25th. Saint John Paul II said "Christ has taught man to do good by his suffering and to do good to those who suffer". A good retreat can be a milestone "experience" in a person faith journey, and I hope you might consider experiencing one.

The Popes of the Catholic Church

Pope LINUS, the Second Pope Was the second <u>Bishop of Rome</u> and <u>Supreme Pontiff</u> (Pope) of the <u>Catholic Church</u>?

His pontificate endured from c. AD 67 to his death. Among those to have been Pope, <u>Peter</u>, Linus, and <u>Clement</u> are specifically named in the <u>New Testament</u>. Linus is named in the <u>valediction</u> of the <u>Second Epistle to Timothy</u> as being with <u>Paul the Apostle</u> in <u>Rome</u> near the end of Paul's life.

According to the *Liber Pontificalis*, Linus was an Italian born in <u>Volterra</u> in <u>Tuscany</u>. His father's name was recorded as "Herculanus". The *Apostolic Constitutions* denominated his mother "Claudia"; immediately after the name "Linus" in 2 *Timothy* 4:21 a "Claudia" is named, but the Bible does not explicitly identify Claudia as Linus' mother. According to the *Liber Pontificalis*, Linus decreed that women should cover their heads in church, created the first 15 bishops, died a <u>martyr</u>, and was buried on the <u>Vatican Hill</u> (presently <u>Vatican City</u>) adjacent to <u>Peter the Apostle</u>. It dated his death as 23 September AD 76, on which date his feast is still celebrated. His name is included in the <u>Roman Canon of the Mass</u>.
